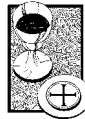

Dear Friends:

In today's Gospel, John the Baptizer steps aside and encourages his followers – and us – to “**behold the Lamb of God.**” The word behold connotes more than just to ‘look’ – it implies wonder, attentiveness and awe. John calls us not just to ‘see’ Jesus in our midst, but to ‘**behold**’ his presence. It means to put aside our fears and stop our constant busyness in order to open our lives to being transformed and re-created in the light of Christ.

In this new liturgical year, let us ‘**behold**’ the Lamb of God among us. In today’s Gospel, the first disciples are invited to look, to see what is before the, to realize who is in their midst. That same invitation is extended to us, the disciples of Jesus in this time, in this place. The challenge of discipleship is to discern and respond to that call within our own lives.

One of our immediate challenges as a disciple of Jesus is to insure that we do everything to protect the unborn. **You have seen in this bulletin over the last month that there is pending legislation (FOCA) in Washington, DC that would establish the right to abortion throughout all nine months of pregnancy as a fundamental right! We can’t allow this to happen!** As a disciple of Jesus Christ, we must see that every unborn child is just that – **a child!** There will be a post-card campaign initiated by the Catholic Bishop’s Conference to write to our senators and representative asking them to defeat FOCA when it is brought to the Congressional floor in the near future. This campaign is scheduled to take place throughout the United States on the weekend of **January 24-25**. Here at St. Augustine’s, everyone will have the opportunity to complete the post cards **before** Mass begins. You are then asked to place them in the collection basket at the Offertory. This might take a few extra minutes, but these few extra minutes will also save the lives of millions of innocent unborn children. Yes, being a disciple of Jesus is challenging! **I know all of us will answer this first challenge of the New Year by supporting this post card campaign.**

Tuesday, January 20th is a historic day for our country as we inaugurate Barak Obama as the 44th President of the United States of America. No matter what our party affiliation might be, as Americans we pray for our new President. We ask God to protect him and his family. **We ask the Holy Spirit to shower our new president with wisdom, understanding, courage and all the spiritual gifts he will need to lead us in these most fearful times.** We pray for all of our elected officials that they will work together to bring about world peace, economic stability, health care and most of all, a respect for all human life – from the womb to the tomb. God bless you this week and we ask God’s blessing on America!
