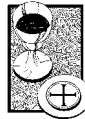

Dear Friends:

St. Paul wants the Corinthians and us to be free from all anxieties and fears. In the Gospel, Jesus shows that he is a person of genuine authority and power. Jesus has just been baptized and is now filled with God's Spirit and he immediately sets about confronting evil wherever he finds it – here by exorcising the unclean spirit. The key to Jesus' authority is his identity. His authority comes from who he is and his mission in the world is clear: to reclaim the world for the kingdom of God by setting people free from the power of the evil one – from sin, sickness, exclusion and death.

Jesus wants us to exercise the same kind of authority and power. The key also rests in our identity, who we are. We are baptized and have received the Spirit of God – giving us the authority to work for God's kingdom. The Spirit gives us the power to live up to our calling as children of God by confronting our own demons, the sin and selfishness to which we are all prone.

Our five-week seminar on St. Paul is rapidly approaching. We will examine the life of Paul, his theology and its influence on the Church and the relevance Paul's writings have for us today. I hope many parishioners will attend this Lenten seminar. **However, please do not wait until the last minute to register!** The number of people attending the seminar will determine where the seminar will be held, so even if you know you cannot make every week, please register by **February 10<sup>th</sup>**.

I thank everyone who participated in the post card campaign last weekend to stop the FOCA legislation. If you want more post cards for your family and friends to sign – more are at the rectory office. In a few weeks, we will begin the penitential season of Lent. It might be a good time now to begin some prayerful reflection to see what demons we need to overcome and how we can grow closer to God and each other. May God bless you and your family this week.

## “FREEDOM OF CHOICE ACT”
